#### **IGNIS**



The school buzzed with affable enthusiasm as the iconic results of class X and XII were announced. In class XII **Neha Kariya** (Science) and **Juhi Jain** (Commerce) with 97.8% each, shared the top position in the school. **Abhijit Upadhyay** (Science) secured the second position with 97.6%, while **Eti Dandekar** (Science) and **Divyanshu Dwivedi** (Science) shared the third position with 97.4% each. They were followed close at heels by **Vanshika Agrawal** (Commerce) with 97%, **Parth Awadhiya** (Science) and **Tanya Agrawal** (Commerce) with 96.8% each. 38.6% of the students registered for the board examination have secured 90% and above, while 77.1% secured 80% and above.

Class X students scripted history with **Swastik Dan** notching the coveted position with 98.8%, closely followed by **Naman Sharma** with 98.6% and **Aashmika Joshi** with 98.4%. Other stellar performers include **Satwik Dash** and **Anushk Singh** with 98.2% each, and **R Srishti**, **Anushri Tomar**, **Swapnil Madan**, **Saanvi Moolchandani** and **Sarvesh Prabhu** with 97.8% each. 84 students secured 90% and above, 80 students scored between 75-90% and 30 students secured marks between 60-75%.

#### **INSPIRE** Awards - MANAK

INSPIRE (Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research) Awards - MANAK (Million Minds Augmenting National Aspirations and Knowledge) being implemented by DST (Department of Science and Technology)-Government of India with National Innovation Foundation – India (NIF) an autonomous body of DST, aims to motivate students in the age group of 10-15 years and studying in classes 6 to 10. The objective of the scheme is to



emphasise on one million unique ideas/innovations ingrained in science for societal purposes to nurture a culture of creativity and innovative thinking among school children.

Adit Singh (VII) with his pioneering approach became the recipient of this award for two consecutive years. He presented the 'kadha' in an ingenious way with the addition of stevia in the form of cuppa noodles to lure children to drink the 'kadha'. The mixture of herbs and spices was embedded in the lower end of a disposable glass sealed with a meshwork. To maintain the glass contents hot for a long time, he used double wall effect by a lining of cardboard further lined with dried green leaves to sustain the heat.

This year too, he received the same award for his paper presentation on a project that enabled him to develop a 'step up toilet' for Arthritis patients. Thus, a teenager with his can-do attitude has proved that 'Excellence is not a skill. It is an attitude'.
